

Devotions fitting for the Consecration of the State of Texas to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

1. History of the Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus:

The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus started during the XVII century in the center of Christendom on both sides of the Alps mountains. It came about as a direct consequence of St. John Eudes' apostolate and the holy dreams infused on St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Hence, this devotion ignited in France and then quickly spread-out all-over Christendom through the Jesuits. Bernardo de Hoyos, a young Jesuit seminarian, also received a vision of the Sacred Heart of Jesus speaking to him the following words: "I will reign in Spain and with more veneration than in any other place". It was May 14th 1733. St. Margarite Mary Alacoque requested the consecration of the Kingdom of France on June 17th 1689. The object of the consecration was so the Sacred Heart of Jesus will triumph over the enemies of Holy Mother Church. King Louis XIV ignored her and as a result, exactly 100 years later, the National Assembly (Liberal, revolutionary and masonic) was created on June 17th 1789. It was in 1875 when the Carlist King, Charles the VII, publicly consecrated Spain to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Orduña (Vizcaya, Basque Country) during the III Carlist War following the request Pope Pius IX made for all nations. The request became very popular in Carlist land and soon many front house doors were decorated with the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, for the protection of the home. It is also interesting to note that between the vision of the young Spanish Jesuit Bernardo de Hoyos and the first Carlist war against Liberalism passed exactly 100 years (1733-1833) as well. There is also the story of another Spanish saint, St. Gemma. She was beatified on May 14th 1933, which was the 200-year anniversary of Bernardo de Hoyos' vision of the Sacred Heart of Jesus ruling in Spain. She suffered numerous ailments and stigmas in her life. She was healed from those by St. Margarita Mary Alacoque's intercession. Her first stigmata ceased to bleed during the solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in 1899. St. Gemma was canonized on May 2nd 1940, year when Prince Sixtus Henry Bourbon (Current legitimate King of Spain) was born. Besides, May 2nd commemorates as well the beginning of the Spanish war against the liberal Napoleonic invasion of Spain in 1808. May 2nd was also the date where Prince Sixtus Henry Bourbon, disguised with false name "Enrique de Aranjuez", swore the oath to the flag of Spain during his enrollment in the Spanish special forces. Once Franco discovered it, he expelled him immediately out of Spain along with the royal family. Besides that, Prince Sixtus Henry Bourbon, who is a direct descent of king Louie XIV, was precisely born on July 22 which is the birthday of St. Margarita Mary Alacoque.

2. Requirements for the Sacred Heart of Jesus devotees:

- ❖ One hour of prayer dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus everyday at fixed time.
- ❖ Daily praying the Litanies of the Sacred Heart of Jesus
- ❖ Daily Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus
- ❖ Participate in the public rosary march once a month. Pray the mysteries with the intentions set, and pray also the act of reparation to the sacred heart of Jesus at the end of the march.
- ❖ Place the Sacred Heart of Jesus visibly in your home. Preferably in the front door.
- ❖ Novena to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque

1. One hour of prayer:

This hour of prayer shall be observed everyday at a fixed time, no exceptions. The hour or prayer will follow St. Ignatius of Loyola's, Patron Saint of the Camino Real de Tejas Carlist Circle, method: Man was created to thank God, reverence him and do his will. And, by employing these means, achieve his salvation. The hour is divided into four quarters: first thanksgiving. Second repentance and sorrow of sins. Third adoration of the Holy Trinity and fourth quarter petition.

To stir piety and devotion on the first quarter, we will use our memory to bring back to us the beauty of Creation; the skies, the land, animals, our Country, our family memories. After that we will give thanks to God enumerating all our faculties, skills and talents given along with the times we recollect God has protected and helped us.

To stir piety and devotion on the second quarter, we will meditate on how many people with much fewer sins than us are burning in Hell for eternity, while God is still having mercy on us on earth, letting us live and therefore having the opportunity to merit.

To stir piety and devotion on the third quarter, we will use the imagination to picture in our minds the sacred heart of Jesus and direct our mental prayer to him, adoring the most Holy Trinity.

To stir piety and devotion on the fourth quarter, we will meditate on the intentions of the public rosary marches for the consecration of the state of Texas to the sacred heart of Jesus along with the petitions of the graces most efficacious towards our sanctification including a horror and repugnance to mortal and venial sin.

2. Litanies to the sacred heart of Jesus:

In 1899 Pope Leo XIII approved this Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus for public use. This litany is actually a synthesis of several other litanies dating back to the 17th century. Father Croiset composed a litany in 1691 from which 17 invocations were used by Venerable Anne Madeleine Remuzat when she composed her litany in 1718 at Marseille. She joined an additional 10 invocations to those of Father Croiset, for a total of 27 invocations. Six more invocations written by Sister Madeleine Joly of Dijon in 1686 were added by the Sacred Congregation for Rites when it was approved for public use in 1899. This makes a total of 33 invocations, one for each year of life of our Lord Jesus Christ. A partial indulgence is attached to this litany.

3. Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus:

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, to Thee I consecrate and offer up my person and my life, my actions, trials, and sufferings, that my entire being may henceforth only be employed in loving, honoring and glorifying Thee. This is my irrevocable will, to belong entirely to Thee, and to do all for Thy love, renouncing with my whole heart all that can displease Thee. I take Thee, O Sacred Heart, for the sole object of my love, the protection of my life, the pledge of my salvation, the remedy of my frailty and inconstancy, the reparation for all the defects of my life, and my secure refuge at the hour of my death. Be Thou, O Most Merciful Heart, my justification before God Thy Father, and screen me from His anger which I have so justly merited. I fear all from my own weakness and malice, but placing my entire confidence in Thee, O Heart of Love, I hope all from Thine infinite Goodness. Annihilate in me all that can displease or resist Thee. Imprint Thy pure love so deeply in my heart that I may never forget Thee or be separated from Thee. I beseech Thee, through Thine infinite Goodness, grant that my name be engraved upon Thy Heart, for in this I place all my happiness and all my glory, to live and to die as one of Thy devoted servants.

4. Intentions for the public recitation of the rosary:

❖ Joyful mysteries:

1st mystery, "The Annunciation": For the consecration of Texas to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

2nd mystery: "The Visitation" For the repentance, penance and conversion of all political, economic and religious leaders of the State of Texas.

3rd mystery: "The Nativity" For the divine heart of Jesus to convert sinners, save the dying and set free the blessed souls in purgatory.

4th mystery: "The Presentation" For the unity of all Texas Christians in the traditional Catholic faith.

5th mystery: "Jesus with the doctors" For the political unity of all Christians in the State of Texas

❖ Sorrowful Mysteries:

1st mystery: "The Agony" For the virtue of purity and modesty in all Texans

2nd mystery: "The Scourging" For the protection of the family in the State of Texas

3rd mystery: "The Crowning with Thorns" For faithfulness in all Texas marriages

4th mystery: "The Carriage of the Cross" For the protection of Children's life, innocence and purity.

5th mystery: "The Crucifixion" For the end of the culture of death: Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia and Sodomy.

❖ Glorious mysteries:

1st mystery: "The Resurrection" For the establishment of the Social Kingdom of Christ the King in Texas

2nd Mystery: "The Ascension" For the end of blasphemy and taking God's name in vain

3rd Mystery: "The Descent of the Holy Ghost" For the end of shopping and non-essential businesses done on Sunday

4th Mystery: "The Assumption" For moral courage, self-sacrifice and zeal for all souls in Texas

5th Mystery: "The Crowning of the BVM" For the poor, the homeless and the discarded in the State of Texas, for theirs is the Kingdom of God.

5. Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus (to be prayed at the end of the rosary marches)

O, most sweet Jesus, whose overflowing charity for men is requited by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before you, eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries to which your loving Heart is everywhere subject.

Mindful, alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask your pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation, not only for our own personal offenses, but also for the sins of those, who, straying far from the path of salvation, refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow you, their Shepherd and Leader, or, renouncing the promises of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of your law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against you; we are now determined to make amends for the manifold offenses against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behavior, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violations of Sundays and holy-days, and the shocking blasphemies uttered against you and your Saints. We wish also to make amends for the insults to which your Vicar on earth and your priests are subjected, for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of your divine love, and lastly for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and teaching authority of the Church which you have founded.

Would, o divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood. We now offer, in reparation for these violations of your divine honor, the satisfaction you once made to your Eternal Father on the cross and which you continue to renew daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of your Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of your grace, for all neglect of your great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past. Henceforth, we will live a life of unswerving faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the Gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending you and to bring as many as possible to follow you.

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mother, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to you, so that we may all one day come to that happy home, where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, God, forever and ever.
